

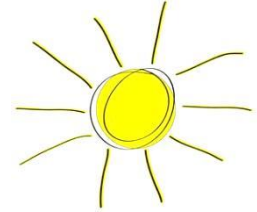

Mini Vinnies Conference 7th May 2014

Two weeks ago St Joseph’s hosted a Mini Vinnies Conference in our school hall. The Mini Vinnies conference was a terrific success with students and teachers from Narromine, Cobar and Nyngan gathering in Mackillop Hall. The conference provided the students with opportunities to mingle with other Mini Vinnies students who are actively helping others in their communities and around the world.

During the day the students heard an engaging presentation from two inspiring local ladies - Mrs Marina Linke and Mrs Julie Walsh who shared some their experiences gained while working abroad for a charity called Sew Aid. Both ladies volunteered their time and skills and travelled to the Philippines and Uganda and taught some of the local women how to sew. Their work was aimed at skilling the ladies so they could earn an income from sewing.

The students then attended various workshops organised and run by teachers and St Vincent de Paul staff. The workshops were based on various topics which included:- homelessness; bullying; mental health; migrants and refugees; overseas partnerships and poverty. These workshops provided students with the opportunity to develop an understanding of these issues and explore ideas about how they can be assisted.

Each school then shared what their Mini Vinnies group does to care for others. Each group raises money in various way to support people locally and internationally. Some ideas that our group took away has already resulted in an upcoming visit to the St Vincent de Paul Centre in Pangee Street and the planning of regular visits to the Mick Glennie Hostel.

Mrs Toole and I were very pleased with how well-mannered, welcoming and engaging our SRC/Mini Vinnies students were on the day. Thank you to the terrific families who provided morning tea for our visitors and Mr Whaley for cooking our barbeque lunch.

Peer Support Program: 'Resilience'

Week 3

Last week in Peer Support children had the opportunity to discuss their personal qualities and strengths. The children identified their qualities and acknowledged how they contributed to their achievements. Through activities children recognised that they used their strengths to achieve success and can be encouraged to approach future activities optimistically.

Ask your child to describe their own qualities and strengths so you can recognise and acknowledge these.

Week 4

This week in Peer Support children will discuss skills on how to communicate their feelings and needs to others. The children will discuss skills they use when participating in a variety of activities. When children understand that they already have many of the skills needed to succeed, they can feel more confident when trying something new. The children are asked to identify events which trigger different feelings.

Encourage your child to remember the skills they have used in one activity when trying something new. Also encourage your child to communicate their feelings and needs.

Week 5

In Week 5 in Peer Support children will revise what they have learned about resilience and discuss the people who show them support. Through a story the children can identify where the character has used her personal qualities, strengths and skills to help her overcome challenges. They will identify times when she needed support to continue. The children will discuss a range of challenges and determine the best person to approach for support. They will consolidate the protective factors for resilience by revising their own strengths and skills and identifying 5 people they can go to for support.

Remind your child of their qualities and skills and encourage them to ask for help in challenging situations.

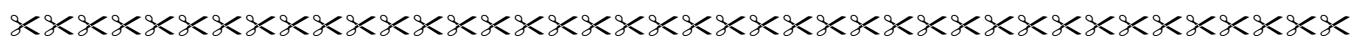
