APPLICATIONS FOR ENROLMENTS FOR 2016

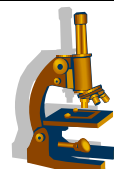

BE ROAD SAFE ATTITUDE MATTERS

Having the right attitude on the road is very important. You are the most important person when it comes to making decisions on your safety. Think about the following situations and come up with the best solutions.



1. **JAMES** is a daredevil. He loves the Crusty Demons and likes to do tricks on his bike. He has been practising for a long time and feels confident to do small jumps in a safe area. You're not as skilled as James and, when he challenges you to do a jump, you don't feel confident about, and he calls you weak. You're wearing a helmet. Do you do the jump and risk potential injury?



2. **YOU'RE** travelling in a car with your family. There's lots of arguing between your brothers and sisters. The driver is getting annoyed and keeps turning around to stop the arguments. The driver is getting very flustered and is driving very fast. What should you do to help the situation?

3. **YOUR** mum has asked you to nip down to the shop to get some milk. Your bike is in the back yard but you can't find your helmet. The shop is only at the end of your street, which is usually a very quiet street. Should you risk riding to the shop just this once? What could go wrong?

4. **YOU'RE** catching the school bus home with your friend for a sleepover and you are very excited. You don't normally catch the bus home because you can walk to and from school. The bus is quite full, and you are stuck at the back. Everyone is busy talking and it's quite noisy. Your stop is the next stop. What is the best way to get off the bus?

5. **YOU** have just finished soccer training and your father is coming by to pick you up. It's quite late in the afternoon and the sun has gone down. Your dad arrives but has stopped on the other side of a busy road. He is beeping the horn because he's in a hurry and is speaking on his mobile phone. There's a lot of traffic and your dad is waving at you to hurry up. What should you do?

6. **YOU'RE** spending the day at your friend's house and it's time to take a trip to the local shopping Centre. Everyone piles into the car and there's no space for you. Your friend tells you to sit on their lap for the short journey to the shopping Centre. What are the problems you have to deal with here? How would you deal with this situation?
